

Useful Information

Sleeping - Each Yurt can accommodate five people. There are two single and one double futon sofa beds which can be folded away in the day to make a pleasant seating area. The single sofa beds can also be pushed together to make a 2nd double. We can also provide an air bed for a 5th person if necessary.

Bedding - We provide comfy feather duvets, pillows and sheets.

Security - The yurts have a lockable door. Although the Yurt be more difficult to get into than a normal tent it is still a tent. If you are worried then take your valuables with you or lock them in your car. Inside Out Camping cannot take responsibility for any loss or damage incurred during your stay.

Facilities - The campsite has the following facilities all within a short walk
Toilets (3 mins) and hot showers (5/6 mins across the road at the Farm)
Washing up area - cold water only (3 mins)
Note - Unfortunately there is no electricity on the campsite and mobile is only slightly possible on some Vodafone networks.

Children - Absolutely yes, it's fun, different and above all exciting. There's also loads of things to do both in the surrounding area and beyond.

Heating - All of our Yurts have a 4 KW wood burning stove which will keep you all cosy and warm. One bag of firewood is provided with extras on site at cost (£5)

What to bring - We have tried to provide everything you might need to make your stay as relaxing and comfortable as possible. However there are a few things that you will need to bring from home. A torch would be useful for walking around the site in the dark. In addition we advise you bring suitable clothes and footwear for all conditions, the Lake District can be somewhat unpredictable. Having a specific inside pair of shoes is useful as it keeps the majority of the inside clean and dry.

Pets - We are pet friendly by arrangement - please email or call us first.

Food Shops - There are several shops in Keswick which is a 15 min drive away. It has a Booths supermarket with a car park (pay and display, but redeemable when spending over £5).
The town has several small food shop and a great market on a Saturday and Thursday.

Pub/Restaurant - In Stonethwaite about 1.25 miles towards Keswick is the Langstrath Inn - www.langstrath.com

The Scafell Inn is a 1.5 miles north on the main road towards Keswick. There is also the The Flock Inn cafe in Rosthwaite which combines cafe and farm shop. www.borrowdaleherdwick.co.uk

The famous Shepherds Cafe (4.5 miles north) is just past the Borrowdale Hotel at High Ladore Farm. This is very popular with climbers and walkers and has excellent service, reasonably priced food and great outdoor seating. (They do a cracking cooked breakfast before 11.00am)

Nearby town/Village - Seatoller is only a small hamlet 2 mins from the site. Keswick is the main town with shops, restaurants, cafes and numerous outdoor shops. North of Seatoller are the small hamlets of Rosthwaite, Seathwaite and the village of Grange. The main TIC is at the Moot Hall in the centre of Keswick (017687 772645)

Bus Stop - The nearest bus stop is 200m from the campsite. It is to the right hand side of Seatoller Farm house. The Borrowdale Rambler service runs up and down the valley from Keswick bus station to Seatoller and back.

Nearest Lake - Derwent Water is a 10 mins drive back towards Keswick. If you drive around the lake there are several car parks from which to access it. Ferry boats run on the lake stopping various points. www.keswick-launch.co.uk Buttermere to the west and Bassenthwaite to the northwest are also easily reached.

Walks - There are walks starting from the campsite which are suitable for families. There is an easy walk along the valley from the site to Rosthwaite and Grange (via Castle Crag if desired).

Mountain Biking - Keswick is fast becoming a top destination for mountain biking with the opening of the new purpose built trails in Whinlatter Forest (10 min west of Keswick along the A66).
